1.0 PREFACE

Mr. Speaker Sir, on behalf of the members of the Housing and sanitation Committee, it is my pleasure and duty to present to the House the Committee's report on the connection of sewer lines in Webuye Hospital Medical Quarters and Drivers Quarters in lower Milimani Estate, Bungoma.

1.2 THE MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

CHAPTER TWO

2.1 INTRODUCTION

2.1.1 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Mr. Speaker Sir,

There was public outcry about the physical status of the two sewers at Webuye Hospital Medical Quarters and Drivers Quarters in lower Milimani Estate in Bungoma. This prompted the committee to assess the physical status of the two sewers and analyzing their effectiveness in offering services to the staff of the County. The committee then relayed the information to the relevant department of Housing and Sanitation but the department indicated that the section was currently under the County department of Health and Sanitation. Nevertheless, the department stated that an amount of Kshs. 5 million was allocated for connection of the two sewer lines and that the same amount was directed to the relevant department for implementation of the projects. Therefore, the committee found it prudent to invite the concerned officers in the department of health and sanitation to shade light on the matter.

2.1.2 TERMS OF REFERENCE

The committee sought information from the department of Health and Sanitation through a consultative meeting held at Iko Resort Hotel, Chwele. The scope of the discussion captured the following areas of interest to the committee;

- i. The actual area of coverage of the sewer lines in Webuye Hospital Medical Quarters and Drivers Quarters in lower Milimani Estate, Bungoma.
- ii. The financial status/allocation for the FY 2018/19 and 2019/20 for the two sewer lines.
- iii. The current physical and implementation status of the two sewer lines

2.1.3 RESPONSE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SANITATION

Mr. Speaker Sir,

During the consultative meetings, the department confirmed that there were actually three (3) soak pits for Webuye Hospital Medical Quarters and a septic tank plus one (1) soak pit for the drivers' quarters in lower Milimani Estate- Bungoma.

It was also reported that the department had received the project allocation of Kshs. 5.6 million in the FY 2018/19 which was previously under Housing and sanitation. The department did get the bills of quantities done and the same was captured in the Further, that requisition Procurement plan. that was done Ref. CG/BGM/MOH/Vol.1/117 dated 14th November, 2018 for initiation of the procurement process but only one bidder responded because it was a restricted bidder. The department went ahead to do evaluations and the evaluation the committee recommended the project to be retendered. The department however reported that the re-tendering process was not complete by the end of that financial year.

The department further explained that the approved budget of the FY 2019/20 indicated nil allocation towards the same project. Therefore, the Department intends to factor it in the FY 2020/21.

The current physical status of the two sewers remain undone and hence the challenge is still the focus on the allocation and availability of funds.

CHAPTER THREE

COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

Mr. Speaker Sir, after the committee discussions and deliberations on the responses given by the department of Health and Sanitation, the following were observed;

- There was allocation and thus Appropriation of Kshs. 5,600,000 in F/Y
 2018/19 towards implementation of the program
- 2. The sewer line in driver's quarters in Milimani Estate, Bungoma is in a pathetic state. Webuye Medical Hospital Quarters sewer line too require immediate rehabilitation.
- 3. The Directorate of Sanitation initiated tendering process that was never completed.
- 4. The County Government implemented the Finance Act, 2018 by increasing rent payable to its houses yet the sanitation aspect is still in unhealthy state.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Mr. Speaker Sir, the committee therefore makes the following recommendation;

- 1. The directorate of Sanitation to consider re-budgeting for the same program in the FY 2020/21 budget estimates.
- 2. The directorate should consider treating the sewer lines rehabilitation as an emergency and ensure works are initiated as a matter of urgency.
- 3. Departments should always ensure compliance to house resolutions by implementing programs approved by the Assembly within the financial year in which the funds were appropriated.
- 4. All departments in the executive wing should be submitting implementation status of their approved programmes on quarterly basis to enable sector committees carry out in-depth oversight and ensure the budgets are adhered to as approved.
- 5. The directorate of Sanitation should adhere to the Procurement and Disposal Act and its regulations when initiating the tendering process. This will ensure the process is not abandoned before completion.

CONCLUSION

Mr. Speaker Sir, the approval of this report by this Honorable House will serve to provide the much-needed rehabilitation services of the two sewer lines and more specifically for the Department of Health and Sanitation to consider re-budgeting for the same program in the FY 2020/21 budget estimates.

Mr. Speaker Sir, it's therefore my pleasant duty and privilege to present to the House this report for deliberation and subsequent adoption.
