EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Honorable Speaker,

Pursuant to Section 45 (2) of the County Governments' Act, 2012 and Section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 33 of 2017, His Excellency the Governor nominated **Ms. Evelyn Teresa Wekesa** for appointment as the Chief Officer, **Public Service Management and Administration**.

The nomination of the Chief Officer was conveyed to the Speaker of the County Assembly through letter **Ref. No. CG/BGM/CS/GEN/VOL.VI (14) dated 10th April, 2023**.

On Thursday, 13th April, 2023 and pursuant to Standing Order 45 (1), the Speaker of the County Assembly read the Message from His Excellency the Governor communicating the name of the nominee to the House. Pursuant to Section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 208(4), the name of the nominee was committed to the Committee on Public Administration and ICT for vetting and reporting to the House within twenty-one (21) sitting days.

Consequently, and in accordance with Section 7 (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Saturday, 15th April, 2023 inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavits) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in accordance with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Thursday, 20th April, 2023 at 3.00 p.m. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memoranda on the suitability of the nominee for appointment.

Further, in fulfillment of the provisions of Article 196 (1) of the Constitution, Section 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 56(3), the Clerk of the County Assembly on Saturday, 15th April, 2023, notified the public through the print media that the Committee on Public Administration and ICT would conduct the approval hearings on Wednesday 26th April, 2023 at 9:00 am.

The nominee appeared before the Committee as scheduled on Wednesday 26th April, 2023 for approval hearings in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and the County Assembly Standing Orders(2nd Edition) on the suitability or otherwise for appointment to the position of County Chief Officer, Public Service Management and Administration.

CHAPTER ONE

1.0 PREFACE

Mr. Speaker Sir, Honorable members, on behalf of the Committee on Public Administration and ICT and pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No 217 (5) (g) of the Bungoma County Assembly, it is my pleasure and duty to present to the House, the Committee's report on the Vetting of the nominee for Appointment to the position of Chief Officer, Public Service Management and Administration.

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

The Public Administration & ICT Committee was established on 26th October, 2022 in accordance with the County Assembly of Bungoma Standing Order No.179.

The mandate of the Committee is derived from the Standing Order 217 (5) and matters assigned under the Second Schedule which shall be exercised within the limits contemplated under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

The functions of a Sectoral Committee shall be to;-

- (a) Investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- (b) Consider quarterly reports of the assigned departments and report to the house within twenty one sitting days upon being laid
- (c) Study the programme and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- (d) Study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- (e) Study, access and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- (f) Investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;

- (g) To vet and report on all appointments where the constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 208 (Committee on Appointments); and
- (h) Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 ESTABLISHMENT OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF OFFICER Honorable Speaker,

Section 45 of the County Governments Act 2012, establishes the office of the County Chief Officer. The section provides that the Governor nominates and with the approval of the County Assembly appoints County Chief Officers. Section 45 (1) of the County Governments Act 2012 stipulates that the Governor shall;

- a) *nominate qualified and experienced County Chief Officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board; and;*
- b) *With the approval of the County Assembly, appoint county Chief Officers.*

Additionally, the procedure for approval hearing, issues for consideration and the period for consideration and reporting is provided for under the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, No. 5 of 2017.

2.2 Nomination of the Chief Officer

Pursuant to section 45(I) (a) of the County Government's Act 2012, H.E the Governor, forwarded to the Speaker of the County Assembly, the name of the nominee **Ms. Evelyn Teresa Wekesa** vide letter dated 10th April, 2023 **Ref. No. CG/BGM/CS/GEN/VOL.VI (14)** for vetting by the Committee on Public Administration and ICT and consideration for approval by this House for appointment as Chief Officer Public Service Management.

On the same date, the Honorable Speaker in a message informed the House that he had received the name of the said nominee and committed it to this Committee for vetting and reporting to the House.

2.3 Notification to the House and Committal to the Committee.

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 45(1), on 13th April, 2023 the Speaker, vide a letter **Ref. No. CG/BGM/CS/GEN/VOL.VI (14)** dated 10th April 2023, informed the House of the Governor's message to the House on nomination of **Ms.**

Evelyn Teresa Wekesa, for Chief Officer-Public Service Management for approval by the County Assembly.

Pursuant to Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 56 (1), the name and curriculum vitae of the nominee was committed to this Committee for approval hearings and reporting to the House accordingly.

2.3 Notification to the Public

Article 196 of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 provides that the County Assembly shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of County Assembly and its Committees.

Section 7 (5) of the Act further provides that the Clerk shall notify the public of the time and place for holding approval hearings at least seven days prior to the hearings.

Further, Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that;

“any person may, prior to the approval hearings and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.”

The Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Saturday 15th April, 2023 (**annexure 2**) inviting the public to submit memorandum by way of a written statement on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees in conformity with section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Thursday, 20th April, 2023 by 3:00p.m.

Further, the Clerk of the County Assembly notified the general public on 15th April 2023, in the print media that the approval hearings of the nominee would be conducted on Wednesday 26th April 2023 at 9:00a.m in the County Assembly precincts.

2.4 Notification to the Nominee

On Saturday 15th April, 2023 the Clerk of the County Assembly invited the nominee, in writing and through print media, for the approval hearings in accordance with

Section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

2.5 Clearance and Compliance Requirements.

On the notice of appearance for approval hearings, the Clerk of the County Assembly informed the Nominee to provide Clearance and Compliance requirements from Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Credit Reference Bureau (CRB).

The nominee was compliant as evidenced from all the submitted valid clearance certificates from the above agencies.

2.6 Report of the CPSB on the nomination of the Chief Officer

Honorable Speaker,

The County Public Service Board (CSPB) advertised for the positions of the County Chief Officers in the Standard Newspaper on Tuesday, 4th October, 2022 of which one hundred and nineteen candidates applied for the position of County Chief Officer, Public Service Management and Administration and nineteen applicants were shortlisted and invited for interviews.

The shortlisted candidates were put in the print media (Daily Nation Newspaper) of Monday, 6th February 2023. The interviews were conducted on 24th February 2023. Further, the report from CPSB revealed that, the nominee was among the three names forwarded to H.E the Governor for consideration.

2.7 Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearings

Section 7(8) and (9) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that:

7(8) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

(9) The criteria specified in the schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate.

Additionally, Section 8 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant House in relation to any nomination shall be:

8. *The procedure used to arrive at the nominee*

- (a) *Any Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question, and*
- (b) *The suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualifications meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.*

While conducting the approval hearings, the committee was guided by the provisions of Section 7 (8) & (9), Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

- (a) *Procedure for Nomination*
- (b) *Constitutional and Statutory Requirements*
- (c) *Suitability of the nominees with regard to the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities.*

Procedure for Nomination

Section 45 (1) (a) (b) of the County Governments Act, 2012 confers upon the Governor the power to appoint County Chief Officers with the approval of the County Assembly.

Sections 4 and 6 (1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 further requires the appointing authority, upon nominating a person for appointment, to notify the relevant County Assembly.

In this regard, pursuant to Section 4 and 6(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Governor notified the County Assembly of the nomination of the Chief Officer.

2.8 Memoranda from Members of the Public in respect to the Nominee

Honorable Speaker,

Pursuant to Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017

“Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold office to which the candidate has been nominated”,

The Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Saturday 15th April, 2023 inviting the Public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with section 7 (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

In this regard, by close of business on 20th April, 2023, the Committee had not received any memoranda from the public.

2.9 Pre- Approval Hearing Meeting

The Committee held a pre- approval hearing meeting on Tuesday, 25th April 2023 and noted the following;-

- (i) **THAT**, the nominee had not notified the Clerk of the County Assembly of her withdrawal from the approval process as outlined under section 7(12) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017.
- (ii) **THAT**, the Committee would examine the nominee against the criteria set out in section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEE

3.1 MS. EVELYN TERESA WEKESA: NOMINEE FOR THE POSITION OF CHIEF OFFICER PUBLIC SERVICE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION

Honourable Speaker,

Ms. Evelyn Teresa Wekesa appeared before the committee on Wednesday 26th April, 2023 at 9:00a.m and the Committee examined the nominee against the following criteria amongst others;

i) Date and Place of Birth

The nominee is a female Kenyan citizen of ID number **1159110** born on 28th July, 1972 in Mufungu village, Lwandanyi Ward, Sirisia Sub-county in Bungoma County and does not hold dual citizenship.

ii) Academic and Professional Qualification

The nominee holds a Master of Philosophy in Language Education (English) and Bachelor of Education in Arts (English Literature) both from Moi University. She also holds a Higher Diploma in Project Management from Kenya Institute of Management, Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (K.C.S.E) from Loreto High School, Limuru and a Certificate of Kenya Certificate of Primary Education from St. Mary's Kibabii Girls' Primary School.

iii) Employment Record

She's currently the Acting County Director-Administration in the Department of Education and Vocational Training in the County Government of Bungoma.

She previously worked as a Sub-County Administrator of Sirisia and Kabuchai Sub-Counties.

Before joining the County Government of Bungoma, the nominee had worked for the Teachers Service Commission as a teacher of English/Literature in Maeni Girls' Secondary School for four years and then promoted to a Deputy Principal at Matili and Bituyu Secondary Schools.

iv) Income and net worth

The nominee's net worth is Ksh. 15M.

v) Published writings

She submitted to have published a Master of Education Thesis titled- 'Teaching the Integrated English in Secondary Schools; A study of Teacher Preparedness in Bungoma North District, June, 2013'

vi) Potential Conflict of Interest

Ms. Evelyn Teresa Wekesa cited that the potential areas of interest can be in relation to -recruitment, employment, tendering and administrative work like disciplinary action. She declared that in such cases she will open a register for declaration of interest so that she steps out when such occasion dictates.

vii) Pro-bono/Charity Work

The nominee donated desks to vulnerable schools worth Kshs. 8,000, tiled the church at Kshs. 185,000, bought keyboard and curtains for the church worth Kshs 75,000, offered food and clothes to Kanduyi children's home, donated a television set to Bungoma Prisons and currently pays school fees for five secondary school students and sponsoring three church choirs.

viii) Integrity

The nominee has neither been charged in a court of law nor mentioned in any investigation report or commission of inquiry in the last five years. Equally, she has never been dismissed from her duties or removed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010.

3.1.1 General and Sector Specific Questions

The committee posed several questions to the nominee on her knowledge of public service. The nominee responded as follows:

1. On how she plans to address issues of Financial Accountability and Transparency within the Public Service Management department; she would be guided by PFM Act and various laws that relate to prudent financial accountability and transparency.

2. When asked on how she will handle pending bills in her department

She submitted that pending bills is a matter that has affected the entire County, adding that even the National Government is not spared on the same.

On priority of payment of pending bills; she will carry out thorough scrutiny of all pending bills to ascertain whether the works were done according to the contracts and also prioritize those that have taken long.

3. With regards to recruitment and confirmation of casual workers; the nominee stated that there is need for proper audit to identify those who meet required qualifications as per various cadres of staff. She promised to consider recommendations of the Taskforce on Human Resource, Court ruling on the casuals case and Ad hoc Committee Report.

4. On construction of ward offices and official residence for the Governor & Deputy Governor; Ms. Evelyn Teresa Wekesa informed the committee that she will give priority to the construction of ward offices that will house Members of County Assembly and staff of County Government to improve service delivery at the grassroots level.

On the construction of the official residence of the Governor; she said the move will save the County Government money that is paid as rent, which can be used to fund other projects. She added that construction of Governor and Deputy Governor's residence is provided for in the SRC circular and therefore she will ensure that it is done.

5. About the transfers/deployment/probationary period, disciplinary actions and promotions; she informed the committee that being a member of the

Human Resource Advisory Committee, they were receiving letters of transfers and deployment from different departments and they were being guided by the scheme of service to deploy or transfer. She added that Transfers and Deployment is a common practise in Human Resource management

On whether she has been a victim; the nominee stated that she has never faced any disciplinary action but she has been a victim of deployment.

6. When asked about the current working relationship between the offices of MCAs and Ward Administrators and how she will ensure that both offices work harmoniously; the nominee acknowledged that some Ward Administrators do not know their boundaries and added that there should be clear set out boundaries to avoid conflicts.

She further expounded that some Ward Administrators and area MCAs have cordial relationships but if approved by this Honorable House, she will strive to strengthen the relationship between and among all stakeholders for the benefit of the people of Bungoma.

3.1.2 Committee's observations on the suitability of the nominee

Honourable Speaker,

The committee having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire pursuant to Section 6(8) of the Public Appointment (County Assemblies) Approval Act, 2017, her Curriculum Vitae and having heard oral submission during the approval hearing, the committee made the following observations on her suitability for appointment as Chief Officer Public Service Management and Administration

1. **THAT**, H. E the Governor complied with provisions of Article 179 (2) (b) of the Constitution of Kenya 2010, sections 45 and 66 of the County Governments Act, 2012 and Section 7 of the Public Appointment (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 on the nomination of the nominee.
2. **THAT**, no memorandum was received from the members of the public on the suitability of the nominee for the stated position.
3. **THAT**, the nominee is currently the Acting County Director of Administration in the Department of Education and Vocational Training in Bungoma County Government.
4. **THAT**, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 on Leadership and Integrity.
5. **THAT**, the nominee has not been charged in any court of law in the past five years.
6. **THAT**, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for contravention of the provisions of Article 75(1) of the Constitution.
7. **THAT**, from her submission during vetting she demonstrated competence, leadership, knowledge on matters of administration and well conversant with the role of the Chief Officer Public Service Management and Administration.
8. **THAT**, in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to state office since she is suitable, of high integrity and a Kenyan citizen born on 28th July 1972 in Mufungu Village, Lwandanyi Ward, Sirisia Sub-County in Bungoma County and does not hold dual citizenship.
9. **THAT** the nominee's average score was 78.75%













4.0 COMMITTEE'S GENERAL RECOMMENDATION

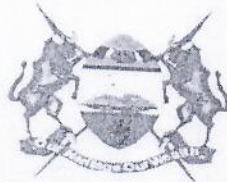
