EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Mr. Speaker Sir,

Pursuant to Section 45 (2) of the County Governments' Act, 2012 and Section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act No. 33 of 2017, His Excellency the Governor nominated Reuben Wambwa Wafula for appointment as the Chief Officer Trade, Energy and Industrialization.

The Speaker of the County Assembly conveyed the nomination of the Chief Officer through letter Ref. **No. CG/BGM/GVN/CA/VOL.I/02 (14)** dated 13th April, 2023.

Pursuant to Standing Order 45(1), on Thursday, 13th April, 2023, the Speaker of the County Assembly read the Message from His Excellency the Governor communicating the name of the nominee to the House. Pursuant to section 4 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 208(4), the name of the nominee was committed to the Committee on Trade, Energy and Industrialization for vetting and reporting to the House within twenty-one (21) sitting days.

Consequently, and in accordance with Section 7 (10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Saturday, 15th April, 2023 inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavits) on the suitability or otherwise of each of the nominees in accordance with the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Thursday, 20th April, 2023 at 3.00 p.m. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had not received any memoranda touching on the suitability of the nominee for appointment.

Further, in fulfilment of the provisions of Article 196 (1) of the Constitution, section 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 56(3), the Clerk of the County Assembly on Saturday, 15th April, 2023, notified the public through the print media that the Committee on Trade, Energy and Industrialization would conduct the approval hearings on Tuesday 25th April, 2023 at 11:30 am.

The nominee appeared before the Committee as scheduled on Tuesday 25th April, 2023 for approval hearings in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and the County Assembly Standing Orders.

CHAPTER ONE

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

Mr. Speaker,

The Trade, Energy and Industrialization committee was established on 26th October; 2022 in accordance with the Standing Order No.179.

The mandate of the Committee is derived from the Standing Order 217 (g) and matters assigned under the Second Schedule which shall be exercised within the limits contemplated under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010.

The functions of a Sectoral Committee shall be to;-

- (a) Investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- (b) Consider quarterly reports of the assigned departments and report to the house within twenty-one sitting days upon being laid
- (c) Study the programme and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- (d) Study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- (e) Study, access and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- (f) Investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;

(g) To vet and report on all appointments where the constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 208 (Committee on Appointments); and

(h) Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

CHAPTER TWO

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Establishment of the office of the chief officer

Section 45 (2) of the County Governments' Act, 2012 states that the office of a county chief officer shall be an office in the county public service.

2.2 Nomination of the Chief Officer Trade, Energy and Industrialisation

Mr. Speaker,

Section 45 (1) (a)(b) of the County Governments' Act, 2012 states that the governor shall nominate qualified and experienced county chief officers from among persons competitively sourced and recommended by the County Public Service Board.

The County Government of Bungoma County Public Service Board made an advert in the Standard newspaper on 4th October, 2022 seeking to recruit competent and qualified person to fill the vacant position of Chief Officer Trade, Energy and Industrialization.

From the documents submitted by the nominee, Mr. Wambwa applied for the position of County Chief Officer Trade, Energy and Industrialization and submitted the letter to the County Public Service Board Office.

2.3 Notification to the House and Committal to the Committee on Trade, Energy and Industrialisation

Pursuant to Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 56 (1), the names and curriculum vitae of the nominee was committed to the Committee on Thursday 13th April, 2023.

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 45(1), the Speaker, vide a communication dated Tuesday, 25th October, 2022, informed the House of the

Governor's message to the House on nomination of Chief Officers, for approval by the County Assembly.

Pursuant to Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 56 (1), the names and curriculum vitae of the nominees were committed to the Committee on Trade, Energy and Industrialisation for approval hearings and reporting to the House.

2.3 Notification to the Public

Pursuant to Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that the Clerk shall notify the public of the time and place for holding approval hearings at least seven days prior to the hearings. Further, Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that;

“any person may, prior to the approval hearings and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.”

Pursuant to Article 196 of the Constitution as read with section 7 (4), and (10) of Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Saturday 15th April, 2023 (**annexure 2**) inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of a written statement on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees in conformity with section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Thursday 20th April, 2023 at 3.00 p.m.

Further, pursuant to Article 196 of the Constitution, Section 7 (5) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and Standing Order 56(3), the Clerk of the County Assembly notified the general public on Saturday 15th April, 2023 in the print media that the approval hearings of the nominee would be conducted on Tuesday 25th April, 2023 at 11:30 a.m. (Annexure 2).

2.4 Notification to the Nominees

Mr. Speaker,

On Saturday 15th April, 2023, the Clerk of the County Assembly invited the nominees, in writing and through print media, for the approval hearings in accordance with Section 7 (4) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

2.5 Clearance and Compliance Requirements.

On the notice of appearance for approval hearings, the Clerk of the County Assembly informed the Nominee to provide Clearance and Compliance requirements from Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Directorate of Criminal Investigations (DCI), the Higher Education Loans Board (HELB) and the Credit Reference Bureau (CRB).

On matters ethics and integrity, the nominee availed before the Committee certified clearance copies issued on diverse dates as follows;

2.6 Report of the CPSB on the nomination of the Chief Officer

Following the advert for the Chief Officer for Trade, Energy and Industrialization dated Tuesday 4th October 2022 by the County Public Service Board, 17 applicants were shortlisted and invited for interviews. From the candidates interviewed the best three were recommended for nomination with Mr. Reuben Wambwa emerged the best and his name was forwarded to the committee for vetting.

2.7 Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearings Issues for Consideration during the Approval Hearings

Mr. Speaker,

Section 7(8) and (9) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 provides that:

7(8) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, person integrity and background.

(9) The criteria specified in the schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate.

Additionally, Section 8 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant House in relation to any nomination shall be:

(a) Any Constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question, and

(b) The suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualifications meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

While conducting the approval hearings, the committee was guided by the provisions of Section 7 (8) and (9) and Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017.

a) Procedure for Nomination

Section 45 (1) (a) (b) of the County Governments' Act, 2012 confers upon the Governor the power to appoint County Chief Officer for the approval of the County Assembly.

Sections 4 and 6 (1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 further requires the appointing authority, upon nominating a person for appointment, to notify the relevant County Assembly.

b) Suitability of the nominees for the proposed appointment having regard to whether the nominees' abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is being made.

Mr. Speaker,

The suitability of the nominee was assessed after scrutiny of the academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, background and qualities as well as their performance during the approval hearings conducted on Tuesday, 25th April, 2023

2.8 Memoranda from Members of the Public in respect of the Nominees

Pursuant to Section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017

The Clerk of the County Assembly placed an advertisement in the print media on Saturday, 15th April, 2023 inviting the Public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominees in conformity with section 7(10) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017. In this regard, by Tuesday, 25th April, 2023 at 11:30 a.m. the committee had not received any memoranda.

2.9 Pre- Approval Hearing Meeting Mr. Speaker,

The Committee held a pre-approval hearing meeting on Monday 24th April, 2023 and noted the following; -

- i. **THAT**, the nominee had NOT notified the Clerk of the County Assembly of his withdrawal from the approval process as outlined under section 7(12) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approvals) Act, 2017.
- ii. **THAT**, the Committee would examine the nominee against the criteria set out in section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS OF THE NOMINEE

Mr Speaker,

The Committee proceeded with the approval hearings on Tuesday 25th April, 2023 and was vetted under oath pursuant to the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and the Standing Orders of the Bungoma County Assembly.

3.1 MR. REUBEN WAMBWA: - NOMINEE FOR THE POSITION OF CHIEF OFFICER FOR TRADE, ENERGY AND INDUSTRIALISATION.

Mr. Reuben Wambwa appeared before the committee on Tuesday 25th April at 11:30 am, 2023 and orally responded to the questions from the Committee Members as follows:

Date and Place of Birth

The nominee is a male Kenyan born on 18th April, 1980, in Kakamega. He confirmed that he is a Kenyan citizen of Id No. **22343854** and did not hold any other citizenship.

Academic and Professional Qualification

Mr Reuben holds a Masters Degree in Business Administration (Strategic management) from University of Sunderland, United Kingdom. He also pursued a Bachelor of Science degree in Applied Business Computing in the same University. Further, he holds a Higher diploma in Computer and Network Engineering, Advanced Certificate in Information Technology and Certificate in Computer Operations and Business Applications all from Mombasa Polytechnic.

Employment Record

The nominee has a cumulative 21 years working experience. He is currently an operations director- Online Safari's where he is leader in promoting and marketing Tourism in the East Africa Region. Mr. Wambwa is also a Board Member, Chairman infrastructure Committee at St. Veronica Ranje High School. He was a technical Manager at Mickey Tronics between 2005 and 2006. Further, from 2002 to 2005 he worked at wananchi online as a system administrator and in 2001 he worked as a sales agent at Madison Insurance.

Income and net worth

The nominee's estimated net worth is 100 million shillings; with his sources of income being salary, rental houses and farming.

Professional association and membership

Mr. Reuben Wambwa was not a member of any professional body at the time he appeared before the committee for approval vetting.

Published writings

The nominee had no publication at the time he appeared before the committee for vetting.

Potential Conflict of Interest

The Nominee stated that there would be no conflict of interest. He further stated that he will strictly adhere to public Service code of conducts and maintain high degree of integrity, ethics and professionalism. The nominee will raise awareness of the

circumstances in which conflicts may arise with the relevant authorities and follow guidelines provided by the authorities on conflict-of-interest issues.

Pro-bono/Charity Work

The nominee is a Board Member of St Veronica Ranje High School on a pro-bono basis. Further he made a donation to Kanduyi Children's home and paid 20,000 towards pews for Siritanyi church.

Integrity

The nominee has never been charged in a court of law nor mentioned in any investigatory report of Parliament or any Commission of Inquiry. He has also never been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution.

3.1.1 General and Sector Specific Questions

i. Roles of Chief Officer

The nominee outlined that the chief officer is the accounting officer of the sector, ensures financial management, strategic policy directions, enhance trade investment and boost Industrialization.

ii. Working relationship

The nominee assured the committee that if appointed he will ensure there's a good working relationship between the County Executive Committee Member for trade and other offices. Further, he reiterated that he will ensure roles and mandates are clearly defined to avoid role conflict. Mr. Wambwa pointed out that he will embrace team

building as a strategy to create personal awareness and foster good working relationship.

iii. Pressure from family and friends

On handling of pressure from family and friends seeking services and favour from the office the nominee acknowledged that we do not live in oblivion. He however, if appointed he will be guided by the requirements of Chapter six of the Constitution and laws governing public officers that ensures impartiality, objectivity and merit.

iv. Plan to improve trade Licensing and Regulations

The nominee if appointed will improve trade licensing and regulations by ensuring sensitization of traders on policies and regulations, offering incentives to traders and avoiding multiple licencing.

v. Trade loans repayment

The nominee if appointed will address the Issue of trade loans and non-repayment of loans that have remained outstanding for a long time by carrying out an analysis in the department, identify issues leading to defaulting, raise business incubation centres and strengthen trade regulations.

vi. Challenges facing the department

The nominee listed major challenges facing the department of trade and mentioned strategies that would be put in place to curb the menace. He proposed that revival of industries, improvement of equipment, partnerships with national and other county

governments, provide linkages to multinationals and capacity building of industries and diversification would help address the challenges.

vii. Activate markets

Mr. Wambwa informed the committee that he was aware that some markets were less active. He cited that he would spearhead a survey to collect information on status of all the markets in the County which would aid in putting proper strategies to address the challenges. He highlighted some strategies that could make dormant markets vibrant such as; suggesting market days, setting up auction rings, and identifying key products. Further, he insisted that markets will be equipped with essential facilities such as toilets, clean water and lighting.

viii. Settlement of Chepkube traders to prevent traffic obstruction,

The nominee confessed that the traders have been by the roadside for a long period of time, if appointed he will find out the status of the market and if it can accommodate all traders then with political goodwill resettle them. Additionally, he will ensure that traders with designated areas get trade loans to boost their businesses.

ix. Energy

In regard to policy direction to bring on board in efforts to harness energy potential within the County special regard to sensitization of the county population on matters solar energy and other green energy alternatives to help mitigate climate change., the nominee outlined that if appointed, he will ensure partnership between County and National government by getting last mile connectivity, fast track partnerships and

budget allocation for projects, street lighting using solar to be guided by policy and regulations and finally motivate businesses going green with discount on licences.

x. County Integrated Development Plan

The nominee exhibited an in-depth understanding of the County Integrated Development Plan and outlined some projects prioritized in CIDP which; include street lighting, upgrade of markets and revival of cottage industries.

xi. Trade across borders

The nominee stated that trade can be improved between Bungoma and neighbouring Counties. He further mentioned of plans to enhance international trade between Bungoma County and outside world by amplification of programs and ensuring that there's a 24hour working economy, participation in regional blocks, policies to revive industries, grow raw materials and policy guidelines for protection and market linkages for traders e.g rivatex.

xii. Empowerment of small traders

The nominee stated that once in office he plans to cushion small scale traders and business startups by the youth in line with the manifesto and plans to make Bungoma an investment hub. Mr. Wambwa promised to give trade loans to traders, capacity building of MSMES'S, value addition, setting up of youth funds, borrow best practices and ensure equitable distribution of resources.

xiii. Honouring Invitations and Summons to the Assembly

Mr. Wambwa pledged that if appointed, he will always honour all the invites and summons to the Committee and the County Assembly.

xiv. Priority areas

The nominee outlined that once appointed he will get a better understanding of issues ailing traders, strengths and weaknesses of the department and measures put in place to increase revenue.

3.1.2 Committee's observations on the suitability of the nominee

Mr Speaker,

The Committee having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire pursuant to Section 6(8) of the Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2017 his curriculum vitae and having heard his oral submission during the approval hearing, made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as County Chief officer-

- (1) **THAT**, the nominee meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity. Further, he provided certificates of clearance from relevant authorities as a prove.
- (2) **THAT** the procedure and the requirements for appointment to the position of Chief Officer stipulated in Section 8 of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies) Act No. 5 of 2017 was followed in the appointment of Mr. Reuben Wambwa.
- (3) **THAT**, no memorandum was received from the members of the public on the suitability of the nominee for the stated position.

- (4) **THAT**, the nominee has not been charged in a court of law.
- (5) **THAT**, the nominee has never been dismissed from office under Article 75 of the Constitution for Contravention of the Provisions of Article 75(1) (conflict of interest), Article 76 (financial probity).
- (6) **THAT**, the nominee is the Managing director RUCA Investment a position he held since January 2010.
- (7) **THAT**, from his submission during vetting he demonstrated knowledge, skills and experience in leadership and institutional management. He was also conversant with the role of the Chief Officer Trade, Energy and Industrialization as well as the mandate of the department.
- (8) **THAT**, in accordance with Article 78(1) and (2) of the Constitution, the nominee is eligible for appointment to State Office since he is a Kenyan citizen born on 18th April, 1980 in Kakamega.
- (9) He exhibited eloquence on vetting questions, confidence and demonstrated exemplary communication skills. Further, he displayed ability to solve professional matters diligently.
- (10) **THAT**, the nominee scored an average of 89% from the assessment made by the Committee on Trade, Energy and Industrialisation.















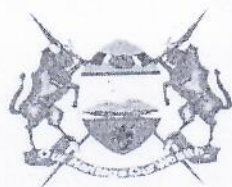
4.0 COMMITTEE GENERAL RECOMMENDATION
