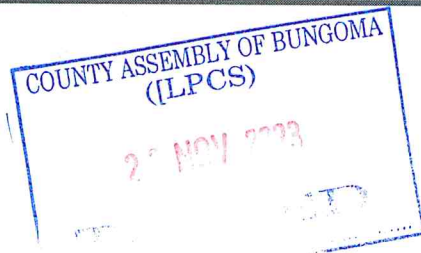

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PREFACE

Mr. Speaker,

It is my pleasure to present the report on the status of Maeni Youth Empowerment Center and the Chemoge High-Altitude Training Center that this House may adopt.

MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee on Youth and Sport falls under Sectoral Committees whose mandate is derived from Standing Order 217 (5) and matters assigned under the Second Schedule which shall be exercised within the limits contemplated under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya 2010.

The functions of a Sectoral Committee shall be to; -

- (a) Investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned departments;
- (b) Study the program and policy objectives of departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- (c) Study and review all county legislation referred to it;
- (d) Study, access and analyze the relative success of the departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- (e) Investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the County Assembly;
- (f) To vet and report on all appointments where the constitution or any law requires the County Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 208 (Committee on Appointments); and
- (g) Make reports and recommendations to the County Assembly as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

One of the most important features of our Constitutional framework is the requirement of the County Assemblies having the mandate to exercise oversight over their respective

County Executives and their organs/departments. Article 185(3) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 on legislative authority of County Assemblies state inter-alia that, `A County Assembly, while respecting the principle of the separation of powers, may exercise oversight over the County Executive Committee and any other County Executive organs.

CHAPTER ONE

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Bungoma CIDP-2023-2027 recognizes the youth in the county and seeks to empower them in different capacities including their talents and capacity build them in various aspects. The County Government through the department of Gender, Culture Youth and Sports has sought to complete and operationalize the Chemoge High Altitude Training Center. Subsequently, the department has also embarked on seeking to operationalize the Maeni Youth Empowerment Center through channeling its resources to establish the development and growth of Youth in the County.

Objectives of the Report

The objectives of this report were to:

- a) Identify the locations and accessibility of these two facilities
- b) Establish the completion status and;
- c) Seek the operationalization of the two centers.

JUSTIFICATION FOR SITE VISITS AND FACT-FINDING

Mr. Speaker,

The Committee in line with exercising its oversight role, studying, assessing and analyzing the relative success of the department as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives, needed to visit the two facilities to ascertain their current status and report on the value for money in these two projects. The Committee also needed to analyze and compare whether the submissions received were really in line what was going on the sites and that the two centers had made progress from allocations in the previous Financial Years.

METHODOLOGY

Mr. Speaker,

The Committee on Youth Affairs and Sports requested for written submissions and all relevant documents vide a letter to the Chief Officer Youth and Sports dated 31st August 2023 **REF N.O BCA /CC/SECT/3 VOL. II (148)**.

The Committee delved into scrutinizing and analysis of the submitted report in its weekly Committee sittings. After scrutiny of the submissions, it proceeded on a fact-finding exercise on Monday, the 11th of September, 2023. The exercise began with a visit to Maeni Youth Empowerment Center and was concluded at the Chemoge High-Altitude Training Center.

It should be noted that the Committee requested the presence of officers from the department to accompany the Committee and respond to any concerns that would arise during the visits. The CECM Gender, Culture, Youth and Sports, provided three officers; Finance officer, Procurement officer and director Sports to provide technical support to the Committee.

CHAPTER TWO

STATUS OF THE MAENI YOUTH EMPOWERMENT CENTER AND CHEMOGE HIGH-ALTITUDE TRAINING CENTER.

1. CHEMOGE HIGH ALTITUDE TRAINING CENTER

Mr. Speaker,

The Chemoge High Altitude Training Center is located in Mt Elgon Sub-County, Kaptama Ward, Chemoge Village. This facility was proposed by the County Government of Bungoma in 2014 and was to be completed in three phases.

The facility intends to offer the following:

- i. To provide training facilities for sportsmen both locally and regionally who have not had such a facility.
- ii. Upon completion the 400-bed capacity camp is supposed to serve Western, Nyanza, neighboring counties, Uganda and other foreign countries who have been jetting to the region for training.

Mr. Speaker,

The project was awarded to Sudafric Group Limited in the FY 2013/14 who was supposed to complete fencing, construction of a gate and a Guard House through a contract number BGM/CNTY/146/2013-14 at a contract sum of four million seven hundred and ten thousand two hundred and forty-three (Ksh 4,710,243.80).

Under the same contract number, the contractor Sudafric Group was also awarded another project on erection and completion for the High-Altitude Training Centre at forty six million four hundred and seventy six thousand three hundred and sixteen (Ksh 46,476,316) within contract period of 12 months. However, in May 2015, the Contractor left the site and was terminated in the subsequent year. The contract was then awarded to Two Calves at a contract sum of thirty-seven million, sixty-eight thousand, six

hundred and twenty-nine (Ksh. 37,068,629.40) through tender number **BGM/CNTY/OT/07/2015-2016**.

Furthermore, Two Calves was also tendered to supply, deliver, install, test and commission sanitary fittings, plumbing, drainage, firefighting and sauna equipment at a contract sum of three million, six hundred and nineteen thousand, five hundred and forty-nine (Ksh. 3,619,549) via tender number BGM/CNTY/OT/09/2015-2016.

In the same year, Glare Technology and Electrical Systems LTD was awarded a contract via a tender number BGM/CNTY/07/08/2015-2016 for supply, delivery, installation, testing, and commissioning of electrical lighting, lightning arrestors and fire detection works at a contract sum of two million, four hundred and thirty six thousand, five hundred and sixty eight (Ksh. 2,436,568). Additionally, Snowpeak Refrigeration and General Construction Limited was awarded a contract via tender number BGM/CNTY/07/08/2015-2016 for supply, delivery, installation and commissioning of kitchen cold room store equipment at a contract sum of one million, eight hundred and forty-seven thousand five hundred and forty (Ksh. 1,847,540).

In the FY 2021/22 two tenders were given to White Calves Ltd under negotiation Number NOG/914218-2021/22 at and YMEE under Contractor Number NED/909874/2021/22 to supply and deliver Gym equipment and Furniture for High Altitude Training Centre and Supply of Kitchenware and equipment for High Altitude Training Centre respectively.

Mr. Speaker,

The facility saw commissioning of Phase II in June 2019 which entailed erecting and completing hostels block at the High-Altitude Training Centre through a contract agreement between County Government of Bungoma and M/S Mid Firm Enterprises Limited under the tender number. BGM/CNTY/G & C/OT/323/2018- 2019, IFMIS negotiation number 723387. The contract sum was totalling Kenya shilling twenty-five million four hundred and ninety-one thousand three hundred and eighty-two (Ksh 25,491,382.80)

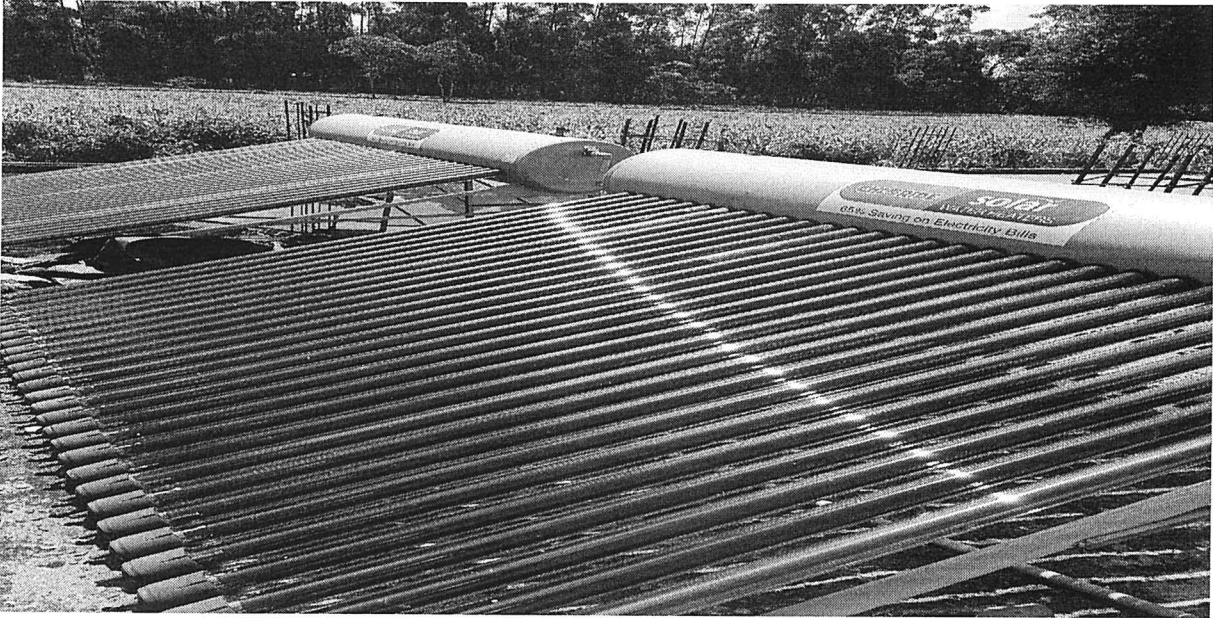


Figure 1: Solar Water Heater at Chemoge High Altitude Training Center

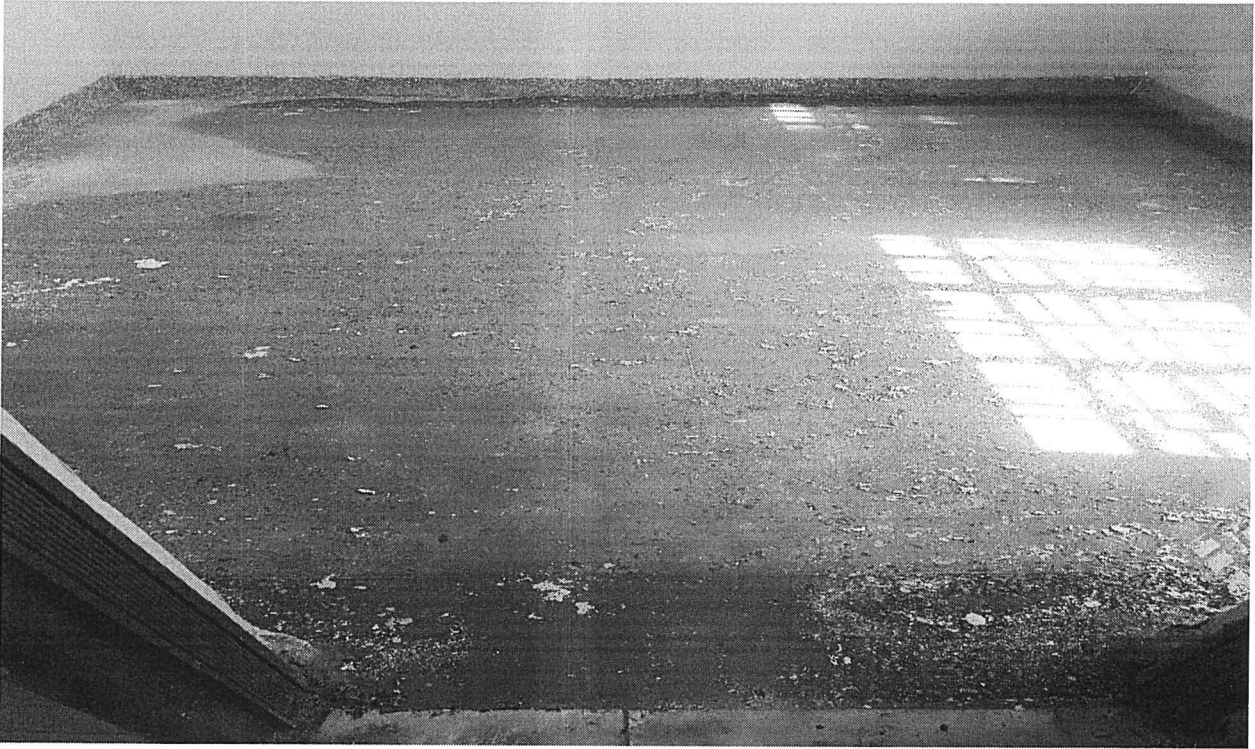


Figure 3: Section of Hostel Room with water sipping through

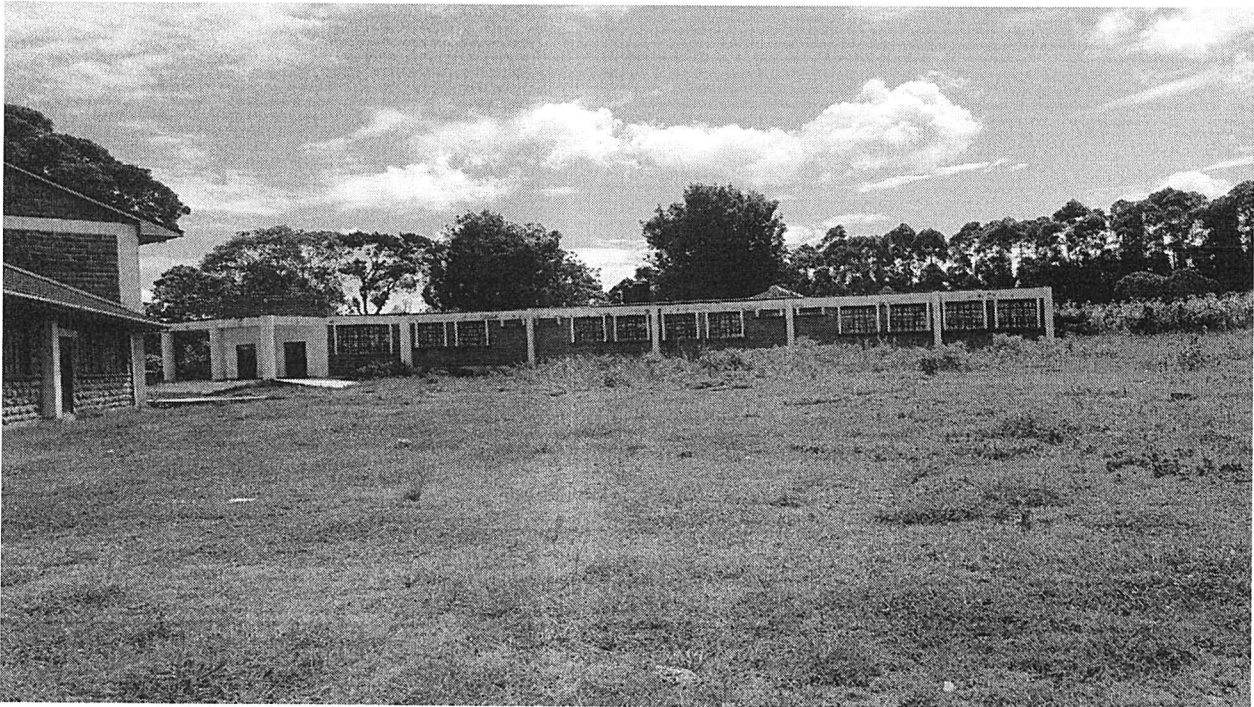


Figure 4: Phase II- Incomplete Hostels

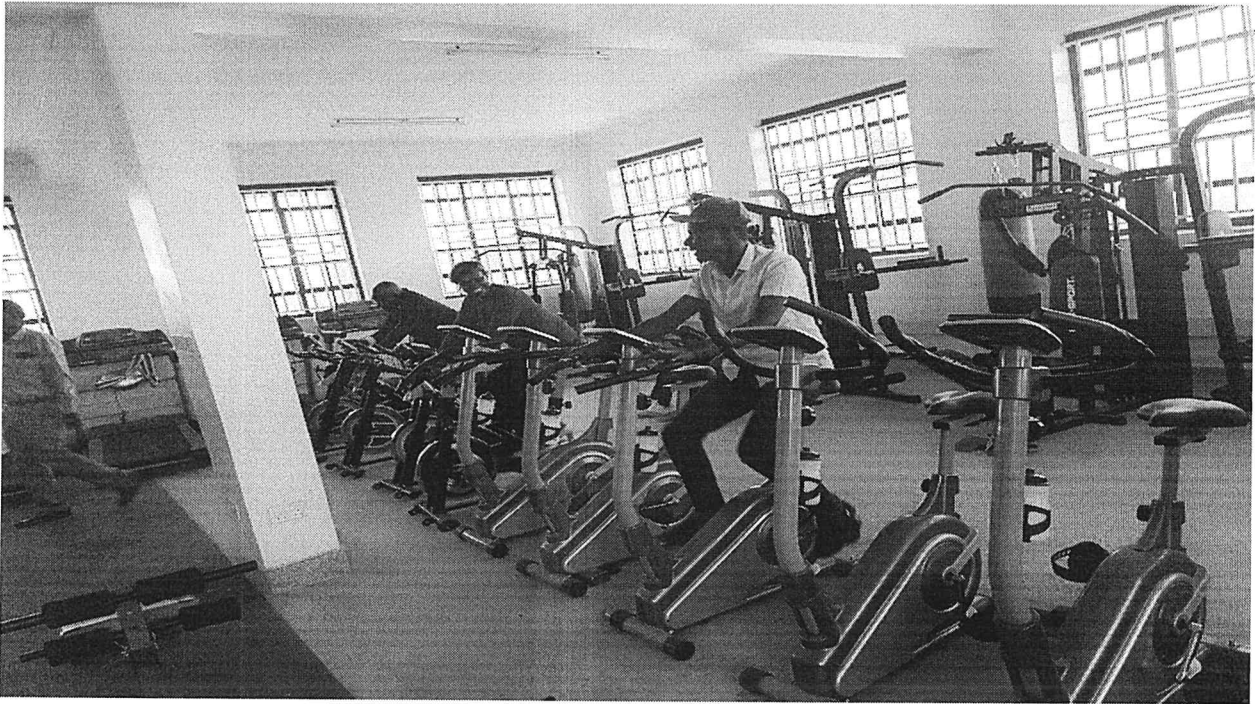


Figure 5: An equipped Gym

2. MAENI YOUTH EMPOWERMENT CENTER

Mr. Speaker,

The Maeni Youth Empowerment Center is located in Kimilili Sub-County, Maeni Ward along Mukopi- Kapsokwony road. The facility sits on a half an acre piece of land.

The Centre has a building that contains a hall that can be used for various activities by the youth. It has a room that will house a cyber for the youth to access ICT solutions and a room for an admin office. The Centre has furniture and computers that can be used to start off but power has not been installed. The equipment has been kept in the ward Admins office at Maeni Centre.

Mr. Speaker,

The department of Gender Culture Youth and Sports advertised for a tender for Proposed Erection and Completion of Maeni Youth Empowerment Centre on 4th April, 2019- Tender Number BGM/CNTY/OT/312/2018-19. The tender was open and put on a newspaper of National supply- The Standard (*see annexure*). The tender bidding automatically closed via IFMIS on Tuesday, 16th April 2019 at 11:00 AM and proceeded to the tender evaluation stage. The evaluation committee was appointed pursuant to section 80 of the Public Procurement and Disposal Act, 205 vide a letter CG/BGM/Y&S/SCM/2019VOL I. (103) dated 29th April 2019.

The tender attracted five bidders (5) and the contract was awarded to LIKIFA (K) LTD at a cost of Five Million, six hundred and seventy one thousand, one hundred and seventy Shillings (Kshs. 5,671,170.40).

The contract period was to run for a period of six months i.e. it was supposed to be completed by 8th December, 2019. As at 1st October 2023, the County Government through the Department of Gender, Culture Youth and Sports has paid a total of Ksh 4,004,888.40 and has a balance of Kshs. 1,666,282. The project is fully complete but yet to be operational.

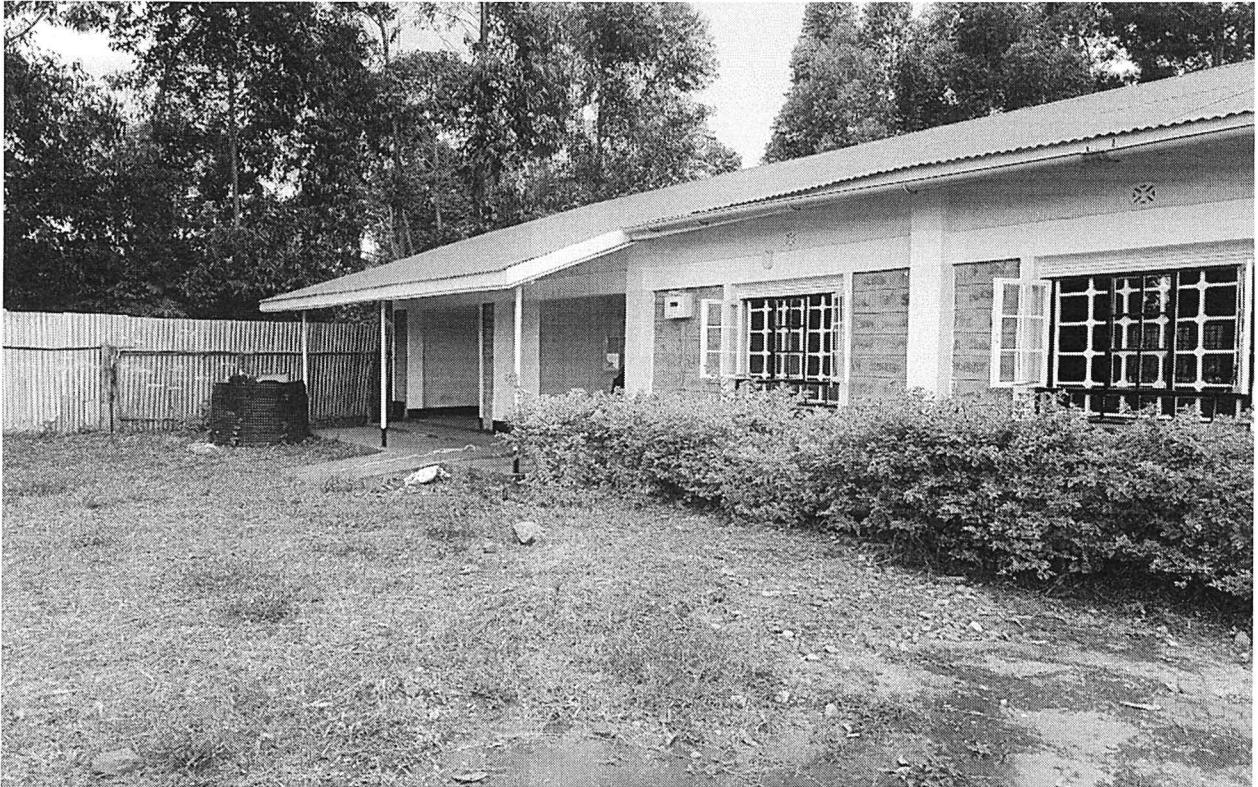


Figure 7: Administration Block of Maeni Youth Center

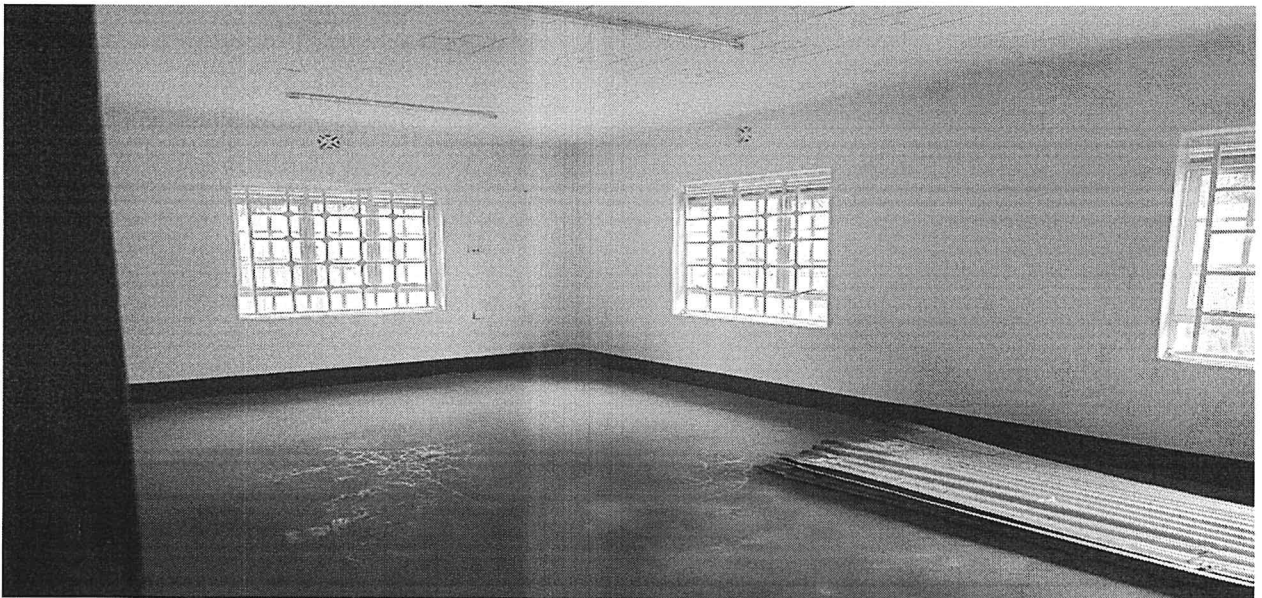


Figure 8: Hall Facility

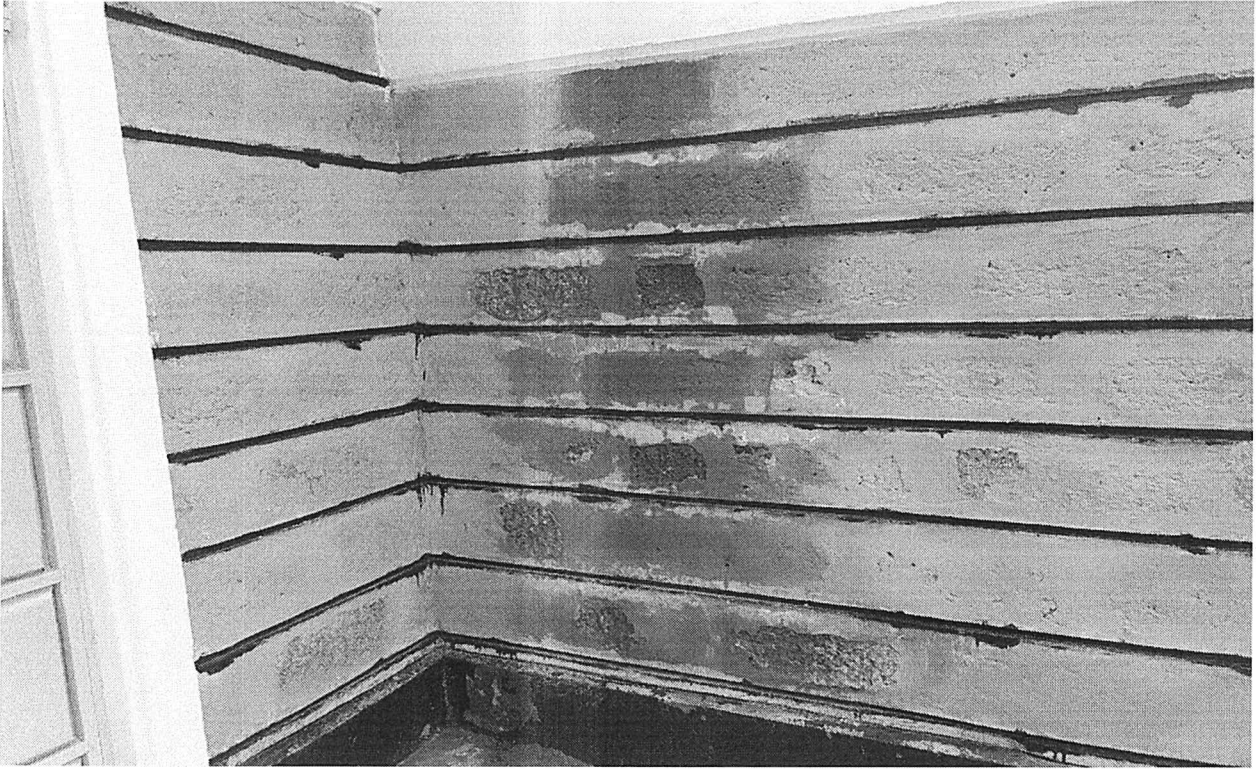


Figure 9: Section of Ablution block wall wearing off

CHAPTER THREEE

COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

OBSERVATIONS

Mr. Speaker,

The Committee made the following observations on the Chemoge High Altitude Training Center;

1. The Chemoge High Altitude Training Center was initiated in 2014, nine years down the line, the project is yet to be operationalized.
2. There have been three contractors involved in completion of Phase I of the High-Altitude Training Center.
3. Snow Peak Ltd and Glare Technology contracts on Supplying, Installation and Commissioning of Kitchen cold Equipment at High Altitude training Center Phase 1 and Supply, Installation and Commissioning of electrical Lighting Equipment at High Altitude Training Centre Phase 1 respectively were terminated.
4. The ground floor of the hostel is complete with several self-contained rooms. However, water accumulated on the roof has been sipping through and some rooms are flooded with water. Additionally, the Hostel has not been equipped.
5. The road leading to the facility was in a good state and made it easily accessible.
6. The hostel has solar power system used for heating water.
7. The land on which the facility sits is secured by a chain link fence and a gate. There was a local resident working as a security guard employed by the contractor.
8. There were supplies stored in the facility ranging from kitchenware, furniture to gym equipment.

9. The facility is neither connected to power grid nor water has been connected.
10. The land on which the facility sits on has not been transferred to the Department of Gender, Culture, Youth and Sports as it still under the Department of Agriculture.

The Committee made the following observations on Maeni Youth Empowerment Center;

1. The road leading to Maeni Youth Empowerment Centre is in good condition making the facility easily accessible.
2. The facility has been fully constructed with an Admin's Office, Computer Room, and a multipurpose hall.
3. There is no perimeter wall to secure the facility. However, it is guarded by a local resident.
4. There is an ablution block that was constructed by the department of Health and Sanitation. However, the wall is made of soil-moulded blocks making it water permeable, unreliable and risky.
5. The amenity has not been connected to the power grid and water line.
6. The facility was equipped under ward-based program (*See attached*). The items have not been moved to the facility due to security concerns and that the facility has no power.
7. The title deed to the land on which the facility sits on has not been processed.
8. The floor at the Maeni Youth Empowerment Center had cracks.

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS.

Mr. Speaker,

The Committee made the following recommendations on Maeni Youth Empowerment and Chemoge High-Altitude Training Centers;

1. **THAT**, the department should endeavor to ensuring that the Chemoge High Altitude Training Center is operationalized as it has been nine years since the onset of the project.
2. **THAT**, the department should award tenders to contractors with capacity to avoid multiple contract terminations and take overs.
3. **THAT**, the department should equip the available/completed hostels on the ground floor. Furthermore, the upper floor should be water-proofed awaiting budgetary allocation for completion.
4. **THAT**, the department should seek partnerships to assist in launch and running of the Chemoge Centre. These include Athletics Association of Kenya (AAK) among others.
5. **THAT**, the department should process power and water application with speed to ensure that both facilities are connected to the power grid and water as this would be essential in operationalizing them.
6. **THAT**, the department should process ownership documents for both pieces of land on which the two facilities sit on.
7. **THAT**, the department should expand land on which both facilities sit on as the space is limited for various activities.
8. **THAT**, in the long run, the department should have a water harvesting and storage plan on both facilities. Additionally, the two facilities should be equipped with standby generators.
9. **THAT**, the Maeni Youth Empowerment Center should be fenced before the equipment is installed and the facility operationalized.
10. **THAT**, the department should consider reflooring the Maeni Youth Empowerment Center using Terrazzo.

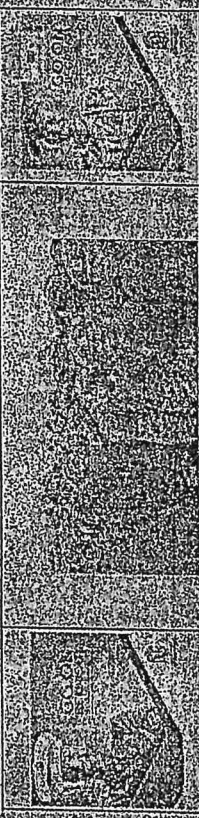

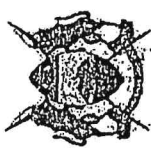
