**PRAYER**

**COMMUNICATION FROM THE CHAIR**

Honourable Members, I do have some communications to make. This is to the County Assembly of Bungoma.

Reference is discharge and placement of Honourable Members to Committees.

Reference is made to Standing Order No.178 (1)(a). The following Members have been discharged and placed as below;

1. Hon. Metrine Wilson Nangila, discharged from Lands, Urban, Fiscal Planning and Housing Committee and replaced by Hon. Maureen Wafula Katila.
2. Hon. Johnston Ipara Okasida discharged from Education and Vocational Training and replaced by the Hon. Isaiah Sudi Busolo.
3. Hon. Linda Kharakha discharged from Trade, Energy and Industrialization Committee and replaced by Hon. Francis Chemion.
4. Hon. Aggrey Bosire discharged from Trade, Energy and Industrialization Committee and replaced by Hon. Everlyne Anyango.
5. Hon. Jackson Wambulwa moved to Selection Committee to replace Hon. Mukhongo Barasa.

Secondly, it has come to the attention of the Chair that there have been repeated breaches of the established rules and traditions of this House regarding decorum during proceedings. These

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breaches disrupt the orderly conduct of business and undermine the authority of the Speaker. Members are reminded that when the Speaker rises or is on his or her feet, all Members must resume their seats immediately.

Further, when the Speaker enters or leaves the Chamber, all Members are expected to stand and maintain silence as part of the ceremonial traditions of the House. It has been observed that some Members remain seated and continue talking instead of observing the required silence and decorum during these formal proceedings.

Some Members use social media platforms such as TikTok, YouTube and Facebook during the proceedings, often creating loud noise that interrupts the flow of business.

Others fail to concentrate on the matters before the House, repeating points unnecessarily or contradicting themselves which disrupts the continuity and effectiveness of the deliberations. Such actions are distracting and compromise the dignity of this House.

Members are further reminded that movement within the Chamber must be conducted with respect for the Speaker and the House. Crossing the Chamber while the Speaker maintains order should be avoided, and Members are expected to acknowledge the authority of the Chair through traditional courtesies such as bowing when appropriate.

It has been observed that some committees have failed to maintain the required quorum while processing business in the House. This has led to delays in proceedings and incomplete consideration of matters before the House. All Members are reminded that quorum requirements are mandatory and failure to observe them undermines the authority of the House, disrupts the legislative process and reflects a lack of commitment to parliamentary duties.

Honourable Members, it has also been observed that attendance to Committees is consistently low; resulting in quorum hitches that affect the smooth conduct of business. For example, the Committee on Youth and Sports this morning in their sitting did not have the requisite number of Members present when the invited Executive Officers appeared before the Committee. The absence of Members, including leadership of the Committee is an indication of neglect of duty and lack of seriousness in fulfilling parliamentary responsibilities.

All Members are therefore urged to uphold the dignity and decorum of the House at all times, observe silence when the Speaker maintains order, refrain from disruptive behavior and following parliamentary procedures are essential for the smooth and orderly conduct of business.

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The Chair directs that these rules and traditions be strictly observed henceforth. Non-compliance will be taken seriously in accordance with the Standing Orders of the House, the authority of the Speaker and the dignity of this House must always be respected.

**Hon. Johnston Ipara:** Honourable Speaker, you have heard Hon. Allan murmuring around because he is familiar with some topics and issues.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Yes, you adhere to the topics and issues, so where are members of that committee?

**Hon. Johnston Ipara:** Honourable Speaker, I want to report that presently in the House we have 7 members, 3 members of our committee are away on official duty at the National Assembly in Nairobi. Please members, let us stand.

*(Members to the sectorial committee on Lands present stood in their places)*

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Honourable members, you know what happens; it is seven plus one.

**Hon. Johnston Ipara:** So we know the sword cuts on both sides and we have no excuses. Hon. Allan should not shout as if he is the defender of the quorum.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Makari, we shall cut you to size...so you are seven and so there is no quorum. So we collapse it.

**Hon. Johnston Ipara:** Hon. Nangalama has just walked out...

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** You should have held her back; she should have waited for this.

**Hon. Johnston Ipara:** Honourable Speaker, you have already ruled on that one and we don't even want to waste time discussing about it.

Now, Honourable Speaker, allow me also to take this opportunity to thank the Committee of Education, where I was up to this minute, where I have been removed. It was a good committee to work with and I appreciate and wish those who have been appointed to that committee to continue doing a good job.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Very well, it is good to appreciate. The report of the sectoral Committee on Lands, Urban Physical Planning and Housing is sent back to the House Business Committee for a rescheduling.

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Meanwhile, Honourable Members let us be serious. I made my communication and some members were not in, but for those who were in, you heard my communication, especially concerning attendance to the plenary and to the committees.

## MOTION OF ADJOURNMENT

**Hon. Isaiah Sudi:** Thank you, Honourable Speaker for giving me this opportunity to move an adjournment motion on behalf of the Leader of Majority.

Aware that the County Assembly of Bungoma is scheduled to participate in the sixth edition of the County Assembly Sports Association, that is CASA, games set to take place in Meru County from 25<sup>th</sup> of October, 2025.

Cognizant of the importance of the adequate preparation and participation in these games and to uphold the Assembly's proud legacy of sporting excellence.

Noting that the Assembly calendar currently provides for regular sittings on Tuesdays, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons at 2.30 p.m. and Wednesday 9.30 a.m.

Therefore, pursuant to the provision of Standing Order 31(4), this House resolves;

1. To adjourn its regular sittings with effect from Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> November 2025 to facilitate the Assembly's full participation in CASA games, and
2. To resume its regular sittings on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2025 at 2.30 p.m.

I therefore, call upon the Deputy Minority Whip, Hon. Allan Nyongesa to second the motion.

**Deputy Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Sudi. Hon. Allan, proceed.

**Hon. Allan Nyongesa:** Thank you, Speaker.

Honourable Speaker, you remember last year we hosted the games in Bungoma County and we emerged number one overall. So we are the defending champions, and we also emerged number one in several disciplines. To prove to other counties that indeed we didn't get those positions just that way, we really need to prepare thoroughly as we go to defend our titles.

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Therefore, I am on my feet to second the motion, that we adjourn the House today Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> and resume on 2<sup>nd</sup> of December to enable us members and the staff, to have enough time for practices. I second.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Alan. Honourable members, allow me now propose a motion to the House for debate

*(Motion proposed)*

**Hon. Anthony Luseneka:** Thank you Hon. Speaker for giving me this chance. It's timely that we adjoin and prepare well for the CASA Games as we are defending champions. I was waiting to hear from the seconder the plans that leadership has put in place for us to travel in terms of welfare, traveling arrangements and any other that will enable us to participate fully in the CASA Games.

As we wind up, please put in place measures that these members, we are traveling in a foreign county, we can't go empty-handed. We need some allowances to be paid in advance so that we prepare well. Last time we hosted, everything was okay because we were at home, but now we are going to a foreign county whereby if we don't have cash, we may end up suffering. So you have one full week as leadership, kindly make arrangements so that we have our allowances in advance.

Secondly, we have two buses, County and Assembly. If they can also be provided for the staff and Honourable Members who may not have transport to Meru so that they can use those facilities to travel to Meru safely.

I also urge members to fully participate in practice because you can't participate if you have not fully practiced. You may end up injuring yourself. So if we can also have a program on the practice starting from tomorrow so that we know, what time are we supposed to be in the field?

I think you have purchased the uniforms and you should communicate now that most of members will not be coming to this Assembly, so that they know when to pick them before they travel.

Lastly, like the volleyball team where Hon. Waiti is our captain, we also urge that we at least have two friendlies initiated by the Assembly so that we also benchmark with other Counties or

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other institutions on how well we can play, we can rate ourselves. So maybe whoever is concerned can respond so that we prepare well for the CASA Games.

*(Applause)*

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Anthony Luseneka for your contribution. Hon. Waiti,

**Hon. Wafula Waiti:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. First of all, I want to congratulate Hon. Sudi for proposing the motion on adjournment so that we may have time as an Assembly to participate thoroughly in our practice. We are aware that we had adjourned and practiced but close to departure time, the games were postponed and members relaxed. Due to that reluctance, members have not been fit and we have been always having that rush hour from the committee sittings and also from the assembly sessions. We might not be having enough time to practice and given the age of some of us, we were not having it good to practice for about 20 minutes then we leave.

As we are adjourned today, I would urge that the individual disciplines, like volley ball team, we urge that we have the field uniform in time so that we may gauge if there are fit for some individuals or not because like last year, we received the uniforms on the playing day but some of us, my friend, Hon. Makari who puts on weight every minute, it was a bit difficult for the uniforms to fit him.

Some of the members were shying off and up to now some of the disciplines we have not seen those playing kits, apart from the hearsay that the uniform is now within the assembly. I wish that we are shown those uniforms in advance, so that we don't face a scenario like last year.

Like the previous year when we were in Nakuru, the volleyball team really suffered. You know we did not have the sports shoes. So some of the players struggled just to put on the way they were and you can gauge now the results. As compared to last year, where we emerged the winners, the champion in the volleyball team because we were equipped well. So I urge as the proposer responds, let him assure the volleyball team that we shall have the playing kits. As it has been, two pairs always and I insist and where you sit you know why a mature person like me and an Honourable Member is trying to insist. Thank you.

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**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Waiti for your contribution. We now have the Hon. Wasike Makari George, Member for Musikoma.

**Hon. George Makari:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. I just want to underscore what my colleagues have put across.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** You know he said that you grow fat and gain weight every minute.

**Hon. George Makari:** I want to dispute that assertion because we are not in the same team.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Makari, you began well by supporting everything he has said.

**Hon. George Makari:** No, I was supporting Hon. Sudi and Hon. Luseneka not Hon. Waiti  
(Laughter)

So but also my good friend Hon. Luseneka said about allowances and buses for transport. You see when you are paid allowance, somebody will not expect you to use the bus because you have money in your pocket and then the way he put it, let's move as a county and Hon. Sudi is here who has moved the motion. Let's ensure that members are logistically enabled to be able to travel to Meru.

The issue of uniforms, Hon. Waiti has spoken about it. There is a year I can't remember, do you know we didn't get the sports gear. I can't remember exactly which year that was and there is another year where the ones that came were too small for us even to wear. So Hon. Speaker this year round, let's hope these things are taken into account. Actually we gave out our measurements, so that somebody should not get an excuse and say we were time-barred. So let the procurement be told that we need some quality uniforms.

There is a year that was 2017-2018, we got some quality tracksuits. I still have mine up to today. But the other ones, from that year going upwards, do you know they are not even there? And even if they are there, they are the poorest quality. The one for the 2017-18, I have never given it out, but the rest that I received, you have never seen me with such shoes anywhere.

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I see members wearing them almost everywhere. You have never seen me with such a shoe, because the quality is poor, I can't put it on. So the moment it lands in my hands, I always give them out. The bottom line is, whatever is getting procured, let's ensure it is good quality.

I always wonder, you find very good men who are participating in sports of women, like my good friend, Hon. Jack Wambulwa. How can just a man be dancing around and twisting your bottom, this is a sport that is actually for women and Hon. Tony Khaoya, why can't they look for this place?

*(Laughter)*

No information, why can't they look for this place that are for men?

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Makari, pause a little we will continue giving her that story, but let's have information from Hon. Jack Wambulwa.

**Hon. Jack Wambulwa:** Thank you, Honourable Speaker. I want to inform Hon. Makari that African dance is for both men and women. It has never been one-sided. When you see me dancing like that, in fact, I'm better off when I dance my body is flexible compared to Hon. Makari, who does not go for any other game other than going to pull the rope. He rarely wins. I always dance and win and bring the flag of East Africa, so it's better.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Makari, you can proceed.

**Hon. George Makari:** Honourable Speaker, are you disputing what he is saying? Hon. Jack knows I go to gym. I'm very flexible. I don't know where he can get this evidence, but who can give this evidence is not here. I welcomed him one day to the gym and he did for two days and ran away. I welcomed Hon. Museveni, he can attest to that. So it's not about flexibility. It's about the discipline.

You see there are disciplines that are actually feminine and then there are disciplines for real men like Hon. Wasike Makari. Hon. Ipara is also in another discipline that he just sits. Which discipline now is that? So I rest my case.

*(Laughter)*

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**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Hon. Ipara, now you have chance to...

**Hon. Jackson Ipara:** Honourable Speaker, you know when you have Jack Wambulwa and you have Makari and Waiti around and you know how they normally conduct themselves. They are classified as sharpshooters. So they know each other and that's why you find Hon. Wambulwa talking about flexibility. I was even wondering where he was watching Makari doing flexibility games. Birds of the same feather flock together. I want to thank the leadership of this House for seeing it wise that we should adjourn the House so that we concentrate on training.

Why is it important that we have time to train? We must have continuous and uninterrupted training. When you continue training as a team, it improves the skills and mastery of the game that you are training for. Like let's speak for volleyball where Hon. Waiti is an expert.

Let's pick the traditional dances where Hon. Jack Wambulwa is always the boy who carries the items for training and where Makari is a serious member in the Tug of War; where strong men and women of the original African are always tested.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** But Hon. Okasida, I don't like interjecting to the flow of an Honourable member. I don't know where you see whoever carries what and whoever does what while you are participating in something.

**Hon. Jackson Ipara:** Honourable Speaker, you clearly heard Hon. Makari saying my game is you sit on the table and you train and I always do the practice on the second floor of our building. I see all that happens around; if you have been watching and you are one of my team members, you have always seen Hon. George Tendet carrying some luggage that is non-classified and this is what I was referring to. Allow me to proceed.

Training together enhances time management. I have always seen Hon. Waiti insisting that he needs his team players to be at the training venue at 2 p.m. Training together gives some people forced discipline. You find that you are where you are supposed to be at the required time, that's why it is very useful for people to have time to train together as a team.

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This also assists one to build self-confidence in the game they are training. You remember you went to the bookshops and bought a new chess board. For the first three days, you had no confidence.

Recently, you have built self-confidence. And that self-confidence will propel you to compete in the real competition as a serious player. And that's why we are saying training changes one from what they were to what we want to be.

We are talking about team spirit which helps the team to identify those serious weaknesses in the team. A good example is if you talk about where Allan is a specialist in football. They know who can play which position well. It helps the team manager and the coach to do those identifications, address those weaknesses, before the real time of the competition. We are not wasting time to suspend the activities of this House to embark on the training.

For every successful organization like Safaricom and Starehe Boys Center, the secret behind that is discipline and when people train together as a team, they build what is called team discipline and self-discipline. So it's worth that we adjourn this House to allow Honourable Members participate in training. You know we are training for a competition that will involve 47 counties. So we are talking of about 47 teams of every event that we are participating in.

It gives one that hope and confidence that now I'm ready for. When we suspended the training last week, I met Allan and others. One of them was Hon. Sudi who has moved at the adjournment today. He was complaining as we were adjourning? Because he had already started picking up and becoming a serious player in the game that he participates.

Lastly, we should talk about welfare, which Hon. Namunyu was referring to. When we talk about welfare, what has already been talked about by Hon. Waiti and Hon. Namunyu. It's about the playing kit. The playing kit itself gives people confidence that they didn't have. When they are walking, they have that confidence. They walk in a style that you can't tell because actually the quality of the uniform they are using; it cannot be compared to any other.

The second thing under welfare is about mobility. We are going to a foreign land and players are supposed to be moved from one playing ground to another. We need to have not less than three

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vehicles that will address the movement of players from one point to the other so that they are not late to report to the venue of the competition.

We also need a vehicle that will address unforeseen incidences of sicknesses. Maybe a player may fall onto a hard ground and they need to be rushed for professional attendance in a medical facility. We need a vehicle that can take them in the soonest possible and we normally say the shortest time you take you save life which is very precious.

The other part of it is about the small things that have a lot of value. That is water, milk, glucose, first aid kit among others. As you plan for allowances for the teams, you should also plan for those small items that we normally forget and if that is done then we shall say the team is now prepared for the competition and if they fail, they will have nothing to say. I support.

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Ipara Okasida for your contribution. Honorable members, allow me call the mover of the motion Hon. Isaiah Sudi Busolo to reply.

**Hon. Isaiah Sudi:** Thank you, Hon. Speaker. I have heard the sentiments of my colleagues; they are talking about welfare. I want to advise the captains who are here, as leadership we are doing our best. We have the kits just as you have heard them before like Hon. Makari, you were here in 2017/2028 actually we had the best games kits. I hope what we have procured now are also of the same standard.

On the issue of welfare members, each one of us needs welfare but there is an incident that happened in this County this year when we had Devolution Conference in Homabay, members were paid, how many of us reached Homabay County?

*(Loud Consultation)*

Most of us didn't go and that is now what is worrying the leadership. That if money is paid to us here, let us all go to Meru to play and cheer others.

Finally, we know apart from games, we are also having an election in Chwele Kabuchai which touches on some of us. We must also consider that, not just games alone. We must also consider the election that we shall have on 27<sup>th</sup> of this month. You know very well how it means to this House. I am urging members be it in kind or any form; let us support our candidate who is none other than a Ford Kenya candidate.

*(Applause)*

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That is our member as Kenya Kwanza; that seat was for Kenya Kwanza. If it were for Azimio, we could have still supported you because it was your seat but now the seat was for Ford Kenya which is a Kenya Kwanza family.

*(Applause)*

I am requesting even members of DAP, let us support...

*(Loud Consultation)*

Let us support our Kenya Kwanza candidate so that that seat where Hon. Mukhongo used to seat; we have a member of our Coalition. We shall be very grateful for all members who will support us.

I have heard all the sentiments of my colleagues and I will address it to the highest echelon of this place and they will all be considered.

Otherwise, I wish you well as you go to practice. Let us practice well and have transport. I think it is better we go in as a team from Bungoma so that when a colleague is having a problem, we will be able to know and address it and when we reach there, let us have brotherhood and sisterhood.

Do not just stay alone in isolation because abduction is still on. You can be abducted and by the time we realize you are not. So members walk with a friend, do not walk alone, and walk with somebody you know. Do not go there and be cheated. I am just advising because life is so precious. Do not go there, let us move together and come back. As you know, when all of us come back that is very good. We shall say Hallelujah to God.

Otherwise, I stop there and wish every member in this House well as they all participate in CASA games.

*(Applause)*

**Mr. Deputy Speaker:** Thank you, Hon. Isaiah Busolo Sudi for the reply. Honorable Members, allow me now put the question. Aware that the County Assembly of Bungoma is scheduled to participate in the 6<sup>th</sup> edition of the County Assembly Sports Association (CASA) games set to take place in Meru County from the 25<sup>th</sup> day October 2025, now therefore pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 31(4), this House resolves to adjourn its regular sittings with effect

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from Thursday the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2025 to facilitate the Assembly's full participation in the CASA games and two, resume its regular sittings on Tuesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of December, 2025 at 2.30 p.m.
