It is notified that pursuant to S.O. 47 (2) (c) the following member will request a Statement for reply before the House.

Statement No. Member for Khalaba Ward (Hon. Cornelius Makhanu -MCA) to seek a Statement from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Roads, Transport Infrastructure and Public Works regarding the status of infrastructure projects initiated ahead of the 2024 Madaraka Day celebrations and the current state of the Dual Carriageway.

In the response, let the Chairperson inquire into and report on the following:

1. REGARDING ROADS CONSTRUCTED FOR THE 2024 MADARAKA DAY CELEBRATIONS

- i) The total mileage (in kilometers) of bitumen-standard roads allocated to and constructed within Bungoma County by the National Government in preparation for the 2024 Madaraka Day festivities.
- ii) A comprehensive list of all roads tarmacked during this period, specifying the implementing agency—whether the Kenya Urban Roads Authority (KURA) or the Kenya Rural Roads Authority (KeRRA).
- iii) The completion status of each identified road project and whether any works remain outstanding.
- iv) Is the department aware of Greenville-Tenstar road that joins Lusaka road was not completed
- v) Whether the Department is aware of the rapid degradation of the Muteremuko–Khalaba River Road, which is currently being eroded by floodwaters. Furthermore, let the Chairperson clarify what urgent interventions KURA/KeRRA are undertaking to salvage the infrastructure, noting that the damage has compromised road safety and left electricity poles leaning precariously over the thoroughfare.

2. REGARDING THE DUAL CARRIAGEWAY ROAD

- i) The exact date the Dual Carriageway was officially handed over to the National Government, supported by documentary evidence including minutes of the handover meetings and the formal Transfer Agreement.
- ii) A disclosure of any outstanding arrears or debts owed by the County Government to the project contractor at the time of handover, and whether the National Government formally assumed these liabilities.
- iii) Whether the National Government was formally appraised of the substandard drainage systems existing on the road at the time of the transfer.
- iv) An explanation regarding the quality of ongoing works on the Dual Carriageway, which appear to be below professional standards. Specifically, why the final leveling layer is failing, leading to surface "peeling" and distress to motorists. The Department should provide a technical assurance of the quality control measures being enforced to ensure value for money and public safety

In the response, let the Chairperson inquire into and report on the following:

1. The financial and non-financial performance of the said entity for the financial years 2023/2024 and 2024/2025.
2. The total amount of unreported bills due to the company for the two financial years in question and the measures being put in place by the management to address the issue.
3. Elaborate whether all bills that were paid to the company during the two financial years were reported by the management as required by law.
4. State how much the company lost during the period in question.
5. State whether the management remitted the statutory deductions deducted from the employees' salaries to the relevant bodies as required by law; and
6. The Department to provide the relevant documentation relating to the said remittance.
