It is notified that pursuant to S.O. 47 (2) (c), the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Public Administration and ICT will respond to the following Statement;

Statement No Statement

Statement No. 27/2026 Member for Bokoli Ward (Hon. Jack Kawa -MCA) to get a response from the Chief Officer, Public Administration and ICT. This is in relation to the status, legality and performance of substantive and acting Directors within various County Departments.

In the response, the following clarification should be provided:

1. Whether all serving Directors within the County Executive Departments were all substantively recruited and appointed by the County Public Service Board in accordance with Article 235 of the Constitution and Section 59 of the County Governments Act, 2012
2. Provide a list of all substantive Directors, Departments, Dates of appointment, and recruitment references.
3. Identify all officers currently serving in acting capacity as Directors
4. State the authority that appointed each acting Director pursuant to Section 73 of the County Governments Act, 2012
5. Provide copies of appointment letters for both substantive and acting Directors
6. Indicate the duration each officer has served in an acting capacity
7. Clarify whether acting appointments have exceeded the recommended six (6) month threshold without substantive confirmation or recruitment
8. Explain why the County Executive has continued to extend acting appointments beyond the recommended legal threshold
9. Indicate whether such extensions comply with the constitutional principles of efficiency and merit under Articles 232 and 235 of the Constitution
10. Provide justification for retention of officers in acting positions despite prolonged service
11. Provide academic and professional qualifications of all Directors, both substantive and acting, in line with merit requirements under Section 65 of the County Governments Act, 2012
12. Confirm whether acting officers meet the minimum qualifications prescribed for their respective positions
13. Provide performance appraisal reports for all Directors
14. Explain measures taken to address underperformance linked

to leadership capacity gaps in line with Article 232(d) on accountability for administrative actions

Statement No. 12/2026 Member for Kimaeti Ward (Hon. Jack Wambulwa -MCA) to get a response from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Tourism, Environment, Water, and Natural Resources regarding the utilization of Climate Change funds within Bungoma County.

In the response, the Chairperson should inquire into and report on the following:

1. Total Disbursement: Provide a comprehensive breakdown of the total amount of Climate Change monies received by the Department from the 2022/2023 Financial Year to 31st December, 2025.
2. Development Status: Submit a detailed report on development allocations, including the implementation status of all projects and programs funded under this kitty, disaggregated by Ward.
3. Distribution Criteria: Clarify the specific criteria used to distribute climate-related interventions or resources across the various wards.
4. Status of tree seedlings: Provide information regarding the status of tree seedlings planted by the Department across the 45 wards during the years 2023-2025
5. Recurrent Expenditure & Imprests: Provide a schedule of recurrent expenditures, specifically detailing all issued imprests, their status (surrendered or outstanding), and the specific disciplinary or recovery actions taken by the Accounting Officer against holders of non-surrendered imprests.
6. Fiscal Transparency: Provide certified printed Bank Statements for all Climate Change Fund accounts covering the period from 1st July 2022 to 31st December 2025.
7. Additional Information: Provide any other pertinent information that may assist this House in assessing the value for money and the impact of these funds on the residents of Bungoma.

Statement No. 22/2026 Member for Kimilili Ward (Hon. Christine Mukhongo -MCA) to get a response from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Roads, Transport, Infrastructure and Public Works. This is in relation to implementation status of the following road projects in Kimilili Ward.

1. Wepukhulu Junction - Murunga- Mafumbo Gabriel Junction Road: Awarded to M/S Sla Co. Limited
2. Pasipalam- Kambini Road: Awarded to M/S Local Engineering
3. Misikhu Main Primary- Chelekei Secondary School Road: Awarded to M/S Ocean Drop

In the response, let the Chairperson inquire into and report on the following:

1. The specific reasons why the Wepukhulu Junction- Murunga- Mafumbo Gabriel Junction Road remains incomplete despite being budgeted for in the FY 2022/2023, and outline the immediate measures the Department is taking to ensure the contractor returns to the site.
2. The official timelines for the completion of the Pasipalam- Kambini Road (FY 2024/2025), considering the contractor has already received an award letter and signed the contract; further, explain what the Department is doing to ensure strict adherence to the contractual timelines to avoid the delays witnessed in previous cycles.
3. The glaring discrepancy regarding the Misikhu Main Primary- Chelekei Secondary School Road, where official records indicate the project is “complete” yet on the ground, works have not even commenced. In this regard, provide the payment status of the said project, including any interim payment certificates (IPCs) processed to date.
