Statement No. 33/2026 Member for Soysambu Mitua Ward (Hon. Stephen Wamalwa - MCA) to seek a Statement from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Finance and Economic Planning and the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Health Services regarding the status of pending bills relating to Makutano Health Centre and Misanga Dispensary
In the Statement, the chairpersons should inquire into and report on the following matters:

1. The current status of the pending bills relating to Makutano Health Centre and Misanga Dispensary, including the contractual obligations, certificates issued, and the stage reached in the payment process.
2. The total amount allocated in the approved budget for settlement of the pending bills for the two health facilities, indicating:
 - a) The total amount appropriated
 - b) The amount disbursed and paid so far; and
 - c) Any outstanding balances yet to be settled.
3. Whether any payments have been made towards the pending bills and, if so, provide:

- a) The names of the beneficiaries/contractors paid;
 - b) The amounts paid;
 - c) The dates of payment; and
 - d) The outstanding certified amounts.
4. The current implementation and operational status of Makutano Health Centre and Misanga Dispensary, including whether the projects are complete, functional, stalled, or pending further works.
 5. The measures being undertaken by the Department of Finance and Economic Planning and the Department of Health Services to ensure that the pending bills are settled within the current Financial Year 2025/2026 and do not spill over to the Financial Year 2026/2027.
 6. The specific administrative, financial, and legal measures the Departments have put in place to fast-track the verification, approval, and payment process for the pending bills in compliance with:
 - a) The Public Finance Management Act, 2012;
 - b) The Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015;
 - c) The County Governments Act, 2012; and
 - d) The Controller of Budget Circulars and Guidelines on Pending Bills Management.
