It is notified that pursuant to S.O. 47 (2) (c), the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Public Administration and ICT will respond to the following Statement.

Statement No. 27/2026 Member for Bokoli Ward (Hon. Jack Kawa -MCA) to get a response from the Chief Officer, Public Administration and ICT. This is in relation to the status, legality and performance of substantive and acting Directors within various County Departments.

In the response, the following clarification should be provided:

1. Whether all serving Directors within the County Executive Departments were all substantively recruited and appointed by the County Public Service Board in accordance with Article 235 of the Constitution and Section 59 of the County Governments Act, 2012
2. Provide a list of all substantive Directors, Departments, Dates of appointment, and recruitment references.
3. Identify all officers currently serving in acting capacity as Directors
4. State the authority that appointed each acting Director pursuant to Section 73 of the County Governments Act, 2012
5. Provide copies of appointment letters for both substantive and acting Directors
6. Indicate the duration each officer has served in an acting capacity
7. Clarify whether acting appointments have exceeded the recommended six (6) month threshold without substantive confirmation or recruitment
8. Explain why the County Executive has continued to extend acting appointments beyond the recommended legal threshold
9. Indicate whether such extensions comply with the

constitutional principles of efficiency and merit under Articles 232 and 235 of the Constitution

10. Provide justification for retention of officers in acting positions despite prolonged service
11. Provide academic and professional qualifications of all Directors, both substantive and acting, in line with merit requirements under Section 65 of the County Governments Act, 2012
12. Confirm whether acting officers meet the minimum qualifications prescribed for their respective positions
13. Provide performance appraisal reports for all Directors
14. Explain measures taken to address underperformance linked to leadership capacity gaps in line with Article 232(d) on accountability for administrative actions

Statement No. Member for Khalaba Ward (Hon. Cornelius Makhanu -MCA) to
34/2026 seek a Statement from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Roads, Transport, Infrastructure and Public Works regarding the implementation of Community Empowerment Fund (CEF) road maintenance projects in Khalaba Ward for the Financial Year 2024/2025.

In the Statement, the chairperson should inquire into and report on the following matters:

1. The status of the road maintenance projects undertaken under the Community Empowerment Fund (CEF) in Khalaba Ward for the Financial Year 2024/2025, including the implementation schedule and current progress of each project.
2. The percentage of work completed for each project and, where works are incomplete, the reasons for the delay or non-completion, including measures being undertaken by the Department to ensure timely completion in accordance with approved work plans and contractual obligations.

3. The list of projects that have so far been paid for, the amounts disbursed for each project, and confirmation on whether the respective works were fully completed in compliance with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and applicable County Treasury Regulations.
4. The list of companies awarded the contracts for the projects, including copies of the letters of award, acknowledgement letters and confirmation on whether the procurement process complied with the provisions of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 and the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Regulations, 2020.

Statement No. Member for Khalaba Ward (Hon. Cornelius Makhanu -MCA) to seek a Statement from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Roads, Transport, Infrastructure and Public Works regarding the Salmond Namuyemba – River Khalaba Road project.

In the Statement, the chairperson should inquire into and report on the following matters:

1. The contract agreement and the letter of award issued for the project, including whether the procurement process complied with the provisions of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 and attendant Regulations.
2. The total project cost and the distance of the road covered under the project as approved in the County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP), Annual Development Plan (ADP), and the approved County Budget.
3. The amount of money paid to the contractor so far and the outstanding balance, if any, in line with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and applicable Treasury Regulations.
4. The Bill of Quantities (BQ) for the project and whether the works undertaken correspond with the approved

specifications and scope of work.

5. The performance bond issued for the project pursuant to the requirements of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 and the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Regulations, 2020.
6. The percentage of work completed to date, the expected completion timeline, and measures put in place by the Department to ensure timely completion and value for public money.

Statement No. Member for Khalaba Ward (Hon. Cornelius Makhanu -MCA) to seek a Statement from the Chairperson, Sectoral Committee on Lands, Urban, Physical Planning and Housing regarding the status of procurement and acquisition of land for the establishment of Bondeni ECDE Centre within Khalaba Ward.

In the Statement, the chairperson should inquire into and report on the following matters:

1. The current status of the procurement and acquisition of land earmarked for the establishment of Bondeni ECDE Centre, including compliance with the provisions of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015 and the Land Act, 2012.
2. The total amount allocated in the approved County budget and/or Supplementary Budget for the acquisition of land and establishment of the ECDE Centres, including the amount spent so far and any pending balances, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.
3. Whether any payments have been made towards the land acquisition process, indicating the beneficiaries, amounts paid, and whether due process was followed in accordance with the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 and the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act, 2015.

4. The measures the relevant Department has put in place to fast-track the acquisition process and ensure the timely establishment and operationalization of the Bondeni ECDE Centre for the benefit of the local community.
